Thank you for choosing to share your wedding with us at The Gap Uniting Church. This church is a symbol of God's presence with us, and we trust that in choosing to be married in a Church building it will help you feel His presence. Your wedding will take place within the act of Christian worship, where we acknowledge God's purpose for your life and ask for His help within your marriage and your relationship. This booklet is designed to assist you as you plan for your wedding.

Booking Your Wedding

1. Please confirm the availability of the Church and of our Minister by contacting the Church Office on 3300 2712 anytime from Monday to Friday 9:00 am – 12 noon.
2. You will need to arrange an appointment with the Minister and the "Notice of Intention of Marriage" form will need to be filled in, signed by you and witnessed by the Minister. This form is a legal requirement before a marriage can take place.
3. Please bring your Birth Certificates (or extracts) and, if relevant, any divorce papers for the Minister to sight at this appointment.
4. The purpose of this appointment is to:
 - a. attend to all documentation
 - b. become familiar with the marriage service
 - c. choose hymns, readings, vows etc. for your marriage service
 - d. fulfill the requirement of Preparation of Marriage
5. (**Please note**, you CANNOT be married unless you attend such an appointment, and it must be at least one full month prior to your wedding. This is a legal requirement.)
6. A Wedding Rehearsal is usually held on the evening prior to your wedding and a booking will need to be made in consultation with the Minister.

General Terms and Conditions

1. **Please Note:** Depending on the officiating Minister's insurance cover, proof of public liability insurance may be requested by the church before the use of their premises is permitted. Consequently, the following would apply:

A Licence Agreement (provided by the Church) would need to be completed and returned to the church, together with a Certificate of Currency (proof of paid Public Liability Insurance). Confirmation of the use of the premises can only be confirmed once these documents are approved by the church's Synod office.

2. The use of alcohol on the church premises is not allowed.
3. The throwing of confetti and rice is contrary to the Litter Laws and is prohibited by the Brisbane City Council. Please ensure that your friends and relatives are aware of this.
4. Please leave the church premises in a clean manner.
5. You are very welcome to capture your important occasion on film or video.

(You should choose either A or B)

The couple face each other.

A *One takes their partner's hands and says:*
I, N, in the presence of God
take you, N, to be my marriage partner/husband/wife;
to have and to hold,
from this day forward,
for better, for worse,
for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health,
to love and to cherish,
as long as we both shall live.
This is my solemn vow.

They loose hands.

*The taking and loosing of hands by
each partner signifies their personal
act of commitment.*

They loose hands.

Giving of the Ring(s)

The minister receives the ring(s) and may say:
God of steadfast love,
by your blessing,
let these rings (this ring) be to N and N
a symbol of the vows
that they have made today;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

As the giver places the ring on the ring-finger of the other's left hand, the following words may be said.
N, I give you this ring
as a sign of our marriage
and of the vows that we have made today.

If only one ring is given, the following words may be said by the receiver.
N, I receive this ring
as a sign of our marriage
and of the vows that we have made today.

*In some cultures, gifts other
than a ring are customary.*



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
